## AWARENESS PROGRAM ON ENABLING ENTREPRENEURSHIP THROUGH ACADEMIA AT DON BOSCO COLLEGE, TURA

**August 29, 2023:** The awareness program on "Enabling Entrepreneurship Through Academia" was organized by BIRAC's BioNEST Bio-Incubator (B3I) Facility, NEHU, Tura Campus, in collaboration of Don Bosco College (DBC), Tura on August 29, 2023, at the Don Bosco College of Teacher Education, Tura. The second session, "A STEP AHEAD – DETAILED GUIDELINE FOR IDEA GENERATION & PRESENTATION," included a virtual tour of the B3I facility and an indepth exploration of its infrastructure, handholding programs, accomplishments, available facilities, and activities aimed at promoting entrepreneurship. The session also guided students through the process of developing innovative business ideas and effectively presenting them. Both sessions were highly engaging, fostering stimulating discussions and thoughtful questions that contributed to a dynamic and enriching learning environment.
